2. Members present reviewed minutes from the BOCC meeting on December 7, 2021: MOTION to was made by Dave Fuller and seconded by Jeff Clemons. Vote was unanimous.

### 3. Application for Certification Packets

- a. On a MOTION by Jeff Clemons and seconded Michael Giampietro it was unanimously VOTED to DENY the application of Simão Cardoso (City of Boston) for certification in the capacity of Inspector of Buildings / Building Commissioner. Simão Cardoso has not maintained their local certification as per 110.R7.3.1 Continuing Education Requirements. Simão may resubmit his application once the required credit hours are acquired.
- b. On a MOTION by John Naff and seconded Jeff Clemons it was unanimously VOTED to approve the application of **Moheb Garas** (City of Lowell) for certification in the capacity **Local Inspector** having met the minimum qualifications for said position defined by MGL c 143 § 3. (BO-2290).

(BO-2146).

On a MOTION by Jeff Clemons and seconded Michael Giampietro it was unanimously VOTED to approve the application of **Leonard Lyons** (City of Boston) for certification in the capacity of **Inspector of Building / Building Commissioner** having met the minimum qualifications for said position defined by MGL c 143 § 3. Silva (Town of Leicester) for certification in the capacity of Inspector of Building / Building Commissioner having met the minimum qualifications for said position defined by MGL c 143 § 3. (BO-2250).

# 4. Examination Approval Packets

On a MOTION by Jeff Clemons and seconded by Michael Giampietro it was unanimously VOTED to grant the request of **Brian Baldassare** (No Affiliation) for approval to take the required exams to become certified as a building code enforcement official. Brian Baldassare meets the minimum qualifications set forth by the BBRS for said position of local inspector and inspector of buildings / building commissioner defined by MGL c 143 § 3 and was granted permission to proceed with the required examination process.
- b. On a MOTION by Jeff Clemons and seconded by Michael Giampietro it was VOTED to grant the request of **Robert Brunelle** (Town of Chelmsford) for approval to take the required exams to become certified as a building code enforcement official. The Committee was unable to find sufficient supervisory experience in building construction or design in Harry Kourmanopoulos's résumé to determine if they have the minimum qualifications as defined by MGL c 143 § 3.

Johnson (No Affiliation) for approval to take the required exams to become certified as a building code enforcement official. William Johnson meets the minimum qualifications set forth by the BBRS for said position of local inspector defined by MGL c 143 § 3 and was granted permission to proceed with the required examination process.

On a MOTION John Naff and seconded by Jeff Clemons was unanimously VOTED to acknowledge the New Employee Report Form of Forrest Filler appointed to the position of Local Inspector for the Town of Chilmark. Appointed, not yet certified, on December 3, 2021. Twelve-month grace period expired December 31, 2022. NERF signed by Chair.

On a MOTION Jeff Clemons and seconded by Dave Fuller was unanimously VOTED to acknowledge the New Employee Report Form of Forrest Filler appointed to the position of Local Inspector for the Town of Aquinnah. Appointed, not yet certified, on December 17, 2021. Twelve-month grace period expired December 31, 2022. NERF signed by Chair.

#### 6. Extension Requests to be Certified Packets

R7.1.7.4-5 a conditional appointee may petition the Building Official Certification Committee (BOCC) using the Extension Request form for an extension of time to comply with the examination schedule of R7. Upon establishment of cause, the BOCC may grant such an extension of time as it may consider appropriate.

- a) On a MOTION by Dave Fuller and seconded by John Naff it was unanimously VOTED to grant the request of **David Anderson (Town of Harwich)** for a second extension of time to become certified as a local inspector. Said extension shall expire January 31, 2023.
- b) On a MOTION by Michael Giampietro and seconded by John Naff it was unanimously VOTED to grant the request of **Frank Caridi (Town of Easton)** for a first extension of time to become certified as a local inspector. Said extension shall expire July 31, 2022.
- c) On a MOTION by John Naff and seconded by Michael Clancy it was VOTED to table the request of Louis Cintolo (Town of Wayland) for an extension of time to become certified as a local inspector. The Committee is looking for clarification as to the date Louis was appointed to the position of local inspector.
- d) On a MOTION by Dave Fuller and seconded by Jeff Clemons it was unanimously VOTED to table the request of **John Clancy (Retired)** for an extension to complete the required credit hours.
- e) On a MOTION by Jeff Clemons and seconded by John Naff it was unanimously VOTED to DENY the request of Chenier Durand (City of Cambridge) for an extension of time to complete the required 45 credit hours. Chenier currently has 27 of the required 45 credit hours. The current training cycle was extended by one year due to the State of Emergency. Committee member expressed great concern an individual could not accumulate the required 45 credit hours in four years.
- f) On a MOTION by Michael Giampietro and seconded by John Naff it was unanimously VOTED to grant the request of **George Shaw (City of Cambridge)** for a first extension of time to become certified as a local inspector. Said extension shall expire July 31, 2022.
- g) On a MOTION by Jeff Clemons and seconded by John Naff it was unanimously VOTED to DENY the request of Thomas White (City of Boston) for an extension of time to complete the required 45 credit hours. Thomas White currently has 9.5 of the required 45 credit hours. Thomas White will be retiring March, 2022 and wanted to remain working without maintaining his certification The current training cycle was extended by one year due to the State of Emergency. Committee member expressed great concern an individual could not accumulate the required 45 credit hours in four years.
- h) On a MOTION by John Naff and seconded by Jeff Clemons it was unanimously VOTED to grant the request of **John J. Walsh (Town of Wilbraham)** for a first extension of time to become certified as a local inspector. Said extension shall expire July 31, 2022.

# 7. Hearings

- a) On a MOTION by Michael Clancy and seconded by Jeff Clemons it was unanimously VOTED to grant Dennis Monteiro (Town of Hudson) BOCC 1-2022 for approval to take the required exams to become certified as a building code enforcement official. Dennis Monteiro and Jeff Wood, Building Commissioner Town of Hudson were present for the hearing. After testimony by Dennis Monteiro and support from Jeff Wood the Committee determined Dennis demonstrated he meets the minimum qualifications set forth by the BBRS for said position of local inspector and inspector of buildings / building commissioner defined by MGL c 143 § 3 and was granted permission to proceed with the required examination process.
- b) On a MOTION by Jeff Clemons and seconded by Michael Clancy it was unanimously VOTED to grant James Pike (No Affiliation) BOCC 2-2022 for approval to take the required exams to become certified as a building code enforcement official. After the Committee reviewed the newly submitted résumé and testimony by James Pike the Committee determined James demonstrated he meets the minimum qualifications set forth by the BBRS for said position of local inspector and inspector of buildings / building commissioner defined by MGL c 143 § 3 and was granted permission to proceed with the required examination process.
