- 2. Members present reviewed minutes from the BOCC November 12, 2020 meeting; MOTION to approve was made by **Michael Giampietro**, and seconded by **John Naff**. The vote was unanimous.
- 3. Application for Certification Packets
 - a. On a MOTION by John Naff and seconded by Michael Giampietro it was unanimously VOTED to approve the application of Vargas DaSilveira (No Affiliation) for certification in the capacity of Inspector of Buildings / Building Commissioner having met the minimum qualifications for said position defined by MGL c 143 § 3. (BO-2226).



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- b. On a MOTION by Michael Giampietro and seconded by Robert Speroni it was unanimously VOTED to approve the application of **David Johnson** (City of Boston) for certification in the capacity of **Inspector of Buildings / Building Commissioner** having met the minimum qualifications for said position defined by MGL c 143 § 3. (BO-1977).
- c. On a MOTION by Michael Giampietro and seconded by Jeff Clemons it was unanimously VOTED to approve the application **David Roberts** (FCCIP) for certification in the capacity of **Local Inspector** having met the minimum qualifications for said position defined by MGL c 143 § 3. (BO-2094).
- d. On a MOTION by Michael Giampietro and seconded by Andy Bobola it was unanimously VOTED to approve the application of **Timothy Wicks** (City of Haverhill) for certification in the capacity of **Local Inspector** having met the minimum qualifications for said position defined by MGL c 143 § 3. (BO-2207).

4. Examination Approval Packets

- a. On a MOTION by Jeff Clemons and seconded by Robert Speroni it was unanimously VOTED to grant the request of **Rian Dowd** (Town of Lenox) for approval to take the required exams to become certified as a building code enforcement official. Rian Dowd meets the minimum qualifications set forth by the BBRS for said position of local inspector and inspector of buildings / building commissioner defined by MGL c 143 § 3 and was granted permission to proceed with the required examination process.
- b. On a MOTION by John Naff and seconded by Robert Speroni it was unanimously VOTED to **DENY** the request of **Philip Ryan** (No Affiliation) for approval to take the required exams to become certified as a building code enforcement official. According to Philip Ryan's resume and additional information provided the Committee was unable to determine if they have the minimum qualifications as defined by MGL c 143 § 3.
- c. On a MOTION by Michael Giampietro and seconded by Robert Speroni it was unanimously VOTED to **DENY** the request of **Darroll Salesman** (No Affiliation) for approval to take the required exams to become certified as a building code enforcement official. According to Darroll Salesman's resume and additional information provided the Committee was unable to determine if they have the minimum qualifications as defined by MGL c 143 § 3.
- d. On a MOTION by Robert Speroni and seconded by Andy Bobola it was VOTED to **Table** the request of **Christopher Sciacca** (No Affiliation) for approval to take the required exams to become certified as a building code enforcement official. The Committee is requesting additional information to determine if Christopher Sciacca has the minimum qualifications as defined by MGL c 143 § 3. Roger Fuller opposed.

Appointed, not yet certified, on July 7, 2020. Eighteen-month grace period expires January 31, 2022. *NERF signed by Chair*.
- b. On a MOTION by John Naff and seconded by Bonnie Weeks it was unanimously VOTED to acknowledge the *New Employee Report Form* of **Robert Garside** newly appointed to the position of **Building Commissioner** for the Town of Groton on November 16, 2020. *NERF signed by Town Manager*.
- c. On a MOTION by Michael Giampietro and seconded by Robert Speroni it was unanimously VOTED to acknowledge the *New Employee Report Form* of **Rian Dowd** appointed to the position of **Local Inspector** for the Town of Lenox. Appointed, not yet certified, on November 17, 2020 Twelve-month grace period expires November 30, 2021. *NERF signed by Town Manager*.
- d. On a MOTION by John Naff and seconded by Roger Fuller it was unanimously VOTED to acknowledge the *New Employee Report Form* of **Philp Harris** appointed to the position of **Building Commissioner** for the Town of Phillipston on September 30, 2020. *NERF signed by Chair*.

R7.1.7.4-5 a conditional appointee may petition the Building Official Certification Committee (BOCC) using the Extension Request form for an extension of time to comply with the examination schedule of R7. Upon establishment of cause, the BOCC may grant such an extension of time as it may consider appropriate. All certification requirements are frozen until the termination of the State Of Emergency. Once the State of Emergency has been canceled, individuals will then have the remaining amount of time on their current extension of time or grace period to request another extension of time before the Certification Committee.

a. On a MOTION by John Naff and seconded by Robert Speroni it was unanimously VOTED to grant **Michael Mendoza (No Affiliation)** an extension of time to complete credit hours to maintain his certification.

7. Hearings

a. On a MOTION by John Naff and seconded by Giampietro it was VOTED to **DENY** the request of **Jason Duval** (No Affiliation) for approval to take the required exams to become certified as a building code enforcement official. After testimony by Jason Duval the Committee determined he does not have the required minimum 5 years' supervisory experience as defined by MGL c 143 § 3.
