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DECISION

425 BROADWAY, LLC 425 WEST BROADWAY BOSTON, MA 02110 LICENSE#: 011600317 VIOLATION DATE: 03/16/2013 HEARD: 07/09/2013

425 Broadway, LLC (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, July 9, 2013, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34C- Possession of an alcoholic beverage by a person under 21 years of age (1 count). Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Velez's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts;
- 2. Investigator Velez's Investigative Report dated March 16, 2013; and
- 3. RMV Printout for E. Chipman.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

FACTS

- 1. On Saturday, March 16, 2013, at approximately 9:30 p.m., Investigators Capurso and Velez investigated the business operation of 425 Broadway, LLC to determine the manner in which their business was being conducted.
- 2. Investigators observed a youthful appearing individual, standing near the bar, who was in possession of alcoholic beverages.
- 3. Investigators approached the individual, identified themselves, and asked to see proof of legal drinking age.
- 4. The individual identified herself as Emily Chipman, actual date of birth (age 20).
- 5. Investigators observed Ms. Chipman in possession of a Pink Moscato alcoholic beverage.
- 6. Ms. Chipman stated that the doorman did not check her identification upon entry into the licensed premises.
- 7. Patrick Falard provided safe transportation home to Ms. Chipman.
- 8. Investigators informed Michael Shaw, the manager on duty, of the violation and that a report would be submitted to the Chief Investigator for action.

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CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, \S 34C-Possession of an alcoholic beverage by a person under 21 years of age (1 count). Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
