NOTICE OF SUSPENSION

After a hearing on October 28, 2025, the Commission finds Boston Liquor Group Inc. d/b/a The Liquor & Wine Emporium violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age (3 Counts).

The Commission suspends the license for a period of two (2) days to be served.

The suspension shall commence on Monday, June 1, 2026, and terminate on Tuesday, June 2, 2026. The license will be delivered to the Local Licensing Board or its designee on Monday, June 1, 2026, at 9:00 A.M. It will be returned to the licensee on June 3, 2026.

You are advised that pursuant to the provisions of M.G.L. c.138 § 23, you may petition the Commission to accept an offer in compromise in lieu of suspension within twenty (20) calendar days following such notice of such suspension. If accepted, you may pay a fine using the enclosed form which must be signed by the Licensee and a Massachusetts Licensed Accountant.

You are advised that you have the right to appeal this decision under M.G.L. c. 30A to Superior Court within thirty (30) days upon receipt of this notice.

DECISION

Boston Liquor Group Inc. d/b/a The Liquor & Wine Emporium (“Licensee”) holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, § 15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (“ABCC” or “Commission”) held a hearing on Tuesday, October 28, 2025, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: Ch.138 §34¹ – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age (3 Counts). Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the facts in Investigator Gould’s report.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

¹ Prior to the commencement of the hearing the Enforcement Division amended the violation charged. The Investigator’s Report and the Commission’s Notice of Hearing alleged a violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) to wit: Ch. 138, § 34C Possession of an alcoholic beverage by a person under twenty-one (21) years of age (3 Counts). The charge was amended to reflect an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) to wit: Ch. 138, § 34, Sale or delivery Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age (3 Counts). The Licensee did not object to the amendment.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On Thursday, July 24, 2025, as a result of a complaint filed with this Commission, Investigators Teehan and Gould ("Investigators") inspected the business operation of Boston Liquor Group Inc. d/b/a The Liquor & Wine Emporium ("Licensee").
2. At approximately 4:15 p.m., Investigators observed two youthful appearing male individuals enter the licensed premises and moments later, the males exited the establishment in possession of what appeared to be alcoholic beverages.
3. Investigators approached individuals, identified themselves and requested proof of legal age to purchase and/or possess alcoholic beverages.
4. Underage #1, actual date of birth 1/16/2006 (age 19), stated he was not asked for any identification when he purchased the alcoholic beverages.
5. Underage #2, actual date of birth 3/14/2006 (age 19), stated he was not asked for any identification when he purchased the alcoholic beverages.
6. The underage individuals were in possession of one 12-pack of Twisted Tea malt beverage and two pints of Tito's Vodka which Investigators confiscated.
7. At approximately 5:20 p.m., Investigators observed a youthful appearing male individual enter the store and moments later, the male exited the establishment in possession of a box of what appeared to be alcoholic beverages.
8. Underage #3, actual date of birth 5/20/2009 (age 16), stated he was not asked for identification when he purchased the alcoholic beverages. He was in possession of two 8-packs of Lucky Dog Lemonade, two 4-packs of Surfside, and one nip of Pink Whitney vodka. Investigators confiscated the alcoholic beverages.
9. Given the age of Underage #3, Investigator Teehan contacted his mother and advised her of their findings.
10. At approximately 9:00 p.m., Investigators entered the licensed premises, identified themselves to the clerk, informed him of the violation and that a report would be submitted to the Chief Investigator for further review.
11. Mr. Nadimpalli stated he asked for identification from all individuals this evening before selling anyone alcoholic beverages.
12. Tariq Milton, Licensee and Manager of Record, appeared at the Commission hearing.
13. The Licensee has held a license under M.G.L. c. 138, § 15 since 2015.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the Licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: Ch.138 § 34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age (3 Counts) As a result, the Commission **suspends the license for a period of two (2) days.**
