#### **DECISION**

Johnny's Quik Pik, Inc. d/b/a Johnny's Market (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, § 15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission ("ABCC" or "Commission") held a remote hearing via Microsoft Teams on Tuesday, October 12, 2021, regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. Ch. 138, § 34 Sale or Delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one years of age (1 count). Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the facts alleged in Investigator Teehan's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Investigator Teehan's Investigative Report;
- 2. ABCC Form 43 License Transfer Approval, 1/21/2016;
- 3. Photocopy of Fraudulent Identification confiscated;
- 4. Licensee Stipulation of Facts.

# **FINDINGS OF FACT**

- 1. On Friday, June 26, 2020, Investigators Guarino, Kenny, and Teehan ("Investigators"), conducted an investigation of the business operation of Johnny's Quik Pik, Inc. d/b/a Johnny's Market to determine the manner in which its business was being conducted.
- 2. At approximately 6:15 p.m. while outside the licensed premises, Investigators observed a youthful appearing male subject exit the store in possession of alcoholic beverages. Investigators identified themselves and asked to see proof of legal age.
- 3. The youthful looking male, Underage #1, actual date of birth 11/9/2001 (age 18), was in possession of three (3) bottles of Hennessey cognac and one bottle of champagne.

Underage #1 presented to Investigators a fraudulent North Carolina driver's license that he used to purchase the alcoholic beverages.

- 4. Investigators entered the licensed premises and spoke to the clerk on duty, Modesta Gonzalez. Investigators informed Gonzalez of the violation and that a report would be filed with the Chief Investigator for further action.
- 5. Devyani Patel, Licensee and Manger of Record, appeared at the Commission hearing.
- 6. The Licensee has held a license under M.G.L. c. 138, § 15 since 2016 with no prior violations.

## **CONCLUSION**

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the Licensee violated M.G.L. Ch. 138, § 34 Sale or Delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one years of age (1 count). Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for a period of one (1) day which is hereby deemed served.
