### DECISION

Rebel Restaurants Inc. dba Remy's (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, October 29, 2013, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138 §34 Sale or Delivery of an Alcoholic Beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Temple's Report.

- 2. Investigator Temple's Compliance Check Field Report dated March 20, 2013.

## **FACTS**

- 1. On Wednesday, March 20, 2013, at approximately 7:50 p.m., Investigators Capurso and Temple conducted an investigation of the business operation of Rebel Restaurants Inc. dba Remy's.
- An underage operative, working with investigators, purchased an alcoholic beverage, a container
  of Budweiser beer for five dollars and fifty cents (\$5.50). The underage operative was not asked
  for identification.

# **CONCLUSION**

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138 §34 Sale or Delivery of an Alcoholic Beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
