**DECISION**

**TRUSTEES OF BOSTON UNIVERSITY D/B/A FULLER'S BU PUB  
225 BAY STATE ROAD  
BOSTON, MA 02215  
LICENSE#: 00033-CL-0116  
VIOLATION DATE: 2/06/2025  
HEARD: 5/13/2025**

Trustees of Boston University d/b/a Fuller's BU Pub ("Licensee" or "Fuller's") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, § 12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission ("ABCC" or "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, May 13, 2025, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: Ch.138 §34C – Possession of an alcoholic beverage by a person under twenty-one (21) years of age (3 Counts). Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the facts in Investigator Terasconi's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Investigator N. Terasconi's Violation Report;
2. ABCC Form 43, Transfer of License Approval, 1979;
3. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. On Thursday, February 6, 2025, at approximately 9:50 p.m., Investigators Temple and Special Investigator Terasconi ("Investigators") inspected the business operation of Trustees of Boston University d/b/a Fuller's BU Pub ("Licensee" or "Fuller's").
2. Investigators entered the licensed premises and observed three youthful appearing male individuals in possession of what appeared to be alcoholic beverages.
3. Investigators identified themselves and requested proof of legal age to possess alcoholic beverages.
4. Underage #1, actual date of birth 11/04/2005 (age 19), was in possession of a can of Watermelon High Noon Hard Seltzer. He presented to Investigators a fraudulent New Jersey driver's license bearing his name but a different birth date.


5. Underage #2, actual date of birth 12/23/2005 (age 19), was in possession of a Coors Light beer. He presented to Investigators a fraudulent Texas driver's license bearing his name but a different birth date.
6. Underage #3, actual date of birth 5/01/2006 (age 18), was in possession of a Coors Light beer. He presented to Investigators an imposter Pennsylvania driver's license belonging to his older brother.
7. Each of the underage individuals stated to Investigators that they had not presented any identification when they entered the licensed premises. They had just walked in and ordered alcoholic beverages.
8. Staff members corroborated the statements of the underage individuals and told Investigators that the employee responsible for checking identifications was in the restroom at the time the three underage individuals entered the establishment.
9. Investigators observed that the identification scanner was not in operation, so employees were not able to scan to check for fraudulent identifications.
10. Investigators spoke with employees, informed them of the violations and that a report would be filed with the Chief Investigator for further review.
11. Jonathan Webster, Manager of Record, appeared at the Commission hearing and testified as to changes in policy and the re-training of staff. Mr. Webster stated that all who enter the licensed premises must now present identification and added that the licensee's identification scanner is functioning and in use.
12. Jason Mahler, Associate General Counsel of Boston University, appeared at the Commission hearing and spoke to remedial measures taken to prevent future violations.
13. The Licensee has held a license under M.G.L. c. 138, § 12 since 1979 with no prior violations.

#### CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the Licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: Ch.138 § 34C – Possession of an alcoholic beverage by a person under twenty-one (21) years of age (3 Counts). As a result, the Commission **suspends the license for a period of two (2) days which will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided that no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations are found by this Commission.**
