Construction: A 6-week program to introduce youth to the many building trades. Participants learn the use of tools, academics, safety on the job site, and union entrance requirements.

Health Careers: A 6-week health careers exploration program placing youth in various health departments such as nutrition, occupational therapy, and social services. The program uses guest speakers and field trips to give youth exposure to various health careers. Advanced education, training, and job placement are offered.

Boston Eligible WIA Youth Provider

Appliance Repair: A 6-week appliance exploration program, which introduces youth to the basic principles and practices in the appliance repair field. Students receive training in diagnosing problems and replacing and servicing all of the components of major household appliances. The students also learn about the basic operations of the repair business.

Early Childhood Care and Education: A 6-week program that has two weeks of career exploration within early childhood education given by Headstart staff, including a basic course of child development. This is followed by a 4-week work experience where youth can apply learned materials. After completion, youth are given help to pursue further education or training as needed.

Technology: In collaboration with Verizon communications, this program offers training in software applications and web development. Youth will use the skills they learn at various community service sites to help develop and teach software applications and Web development. Verizon staff will instruct the courses and the career exploration highlighting options in the field. Youth will also have field trips and guest speakers.
