Boylston Beverages Inc. dba Vinny C's Wine & Liquors (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, September 10, 2013, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138 §34 Sale or Delivery of an Alcoholic Beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Bailey's Report.

FACTS

- 1. On Monday, June 3, 2013, at approximately 7:34 p.m., Investigators Doyle and Bailey conducted an investigation of the business operation of Boylston Beverages Inc. dba Vinny C's Wine & Liquors.
- 2. An underage operative working with investigators purchased an alcoholic beverage, a 16 ounce can of Budweiser Light beer, for one dollar and forty-five cents (\$1.45). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138 §34 Sale or Delivery of an Alcoholic Beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
