When will I be called again?

Your valuable participation on a jury disqualifies you from serving on a state court jury again for three years. Typically, you will wait longer than that before your next summons arrives. However, if you receive a summons for federal court jury service, you must respond, because the federal court system may not disqualify you based on the state court jury service you have just finished.

When will I get my Certificate?

You will receive your Certificate of Service in the next week to ten days. Your employer may want a copy of the certificate. Check with the Court Officer or call the OJC if you need a copy of your certificate sooner.



Will my employer pay me?

In most cases, your employer is required to pay your wages for the first three days that you serve. This is true regardless of whether you work a regular, irregular, full- or part-time schedule.

Will the Commonwealth pay me?

If you've served as a trial juror for more than three days, you will receive a check from the Commonwealth in the next week to ten days. You will be paid \$50 per day from the fourth day on. If you've served as a grand juror, the Commonwealth will pay you according to your daily compensation rate.

If you have concerns about your compensation for jury service, contact the OJC at 1-800-THE-JURY (843-5879).

Is counseling available?

Jury service is an important responsibility and the right of every citizen. However, some jurors may find that they are troubled by their experience after the conclusion of the trial.

The Trial Court recognizes that some people may benefit from short-term counseling services after their jury service. Confidential, short-term counseling for jurors is available at no cost.
