1666 Main Street Corp (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, July 9, 2013, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138 §34 Sale or Delivery of an Alcoholic Beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Teehan's Report.

- 2. An underage operative working with investigators purchased an alcoholic beverage, a container of Budweiser Light beer, for two dollars (\$2.00).

As the licensee has been in business for twenty-seven (27) years and has had no prior violations, the Commission issues a WARNING.
