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DECISION

PRESTIGE FOOD & LIQUORS INC. D/B/A BAY STATE FOODS 1420 BEACON ST. BROOKLINE, MA 02446 LICENSE#: 014800079 VIOLATION DATE: 06/09/2016 HEARING DATE: 12/06/2016

Prestige Food & Liquors Inc. d/b/a Bay State Foods (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, § 15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, December 6, 2016, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Lordan's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Investigator Lordan's Compliance Check Field Report dated June 9, 2016; and
- 2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.
- A. Employees Training Certificates; and
- B. Invoice for ID Detection Scanner.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

The Commission took Administrative Notice of the Licensee's record.

FACTS

- 1. On Thursday, June 9, 2016, at approximately 7:30 p.m., Investigators Teehan and Lordan ("Investigators") investigated the business operation of Prestige Food & Liquors Inc. d/b/a Bay State Foods.
- 2. An underage operative, working with Investigators, purchased from the Licensee an alcoholic beverage, a 6-pack of Budweiser Light beer for seven dollars (\$7.00). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence the Commission finds the Licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
