2. The minutes from the BOCC meeting on **November 7**, **2018**, were reviewed by members present; MOTION to approve, with changes, these minutes was made by **Michael Clancy**, and seconded by **Matthew Hakala**.

#### 3. Application for Certification Packets

- a. On a MOTION by Matthew Hakala and seconded by Michael Giampietro it was VOTED to approve the application of Christopher McWhite (City of Lowell) for certification in the capacity of Inspector of Buildings / Building Commissioner having met the minimum qualifications for said position defined by MGL c 143 § 3. (BO-1622). Bill Horrocks recused.
- b. On a MOTION by Michael Giampietro and seconded by Michael Clancy it was unanimously VOTED to approve the application of **Robert Sullivan** (Town of Granville) for certification in the capacity of **Massachusetts Building Commissioner** having met the minimum qualifications for said position defined by MGL c 143 § 3. ### 9. Additional Business / Other matters as not reasonably anticipated 48 hours in advance of meeting

a. For Informational purposes:

There are currently:

- o 734 certified building inspectors -- 300 Local 434 Inspector of Buildings
- o 52 Conditional local building inspectors
- 588 individuals' qualifications have been approved to take the exams, not currently affiliated
- b. Review the statutes and regulations for electrical and plumbing inspectors

Per Statute City of Revere was required to hire plumbing and electrical inspectors for the casino project. 104.4 permits the hiring of a third party to complete inspections. The Building Commissioner reviews and accepts all reports.

DPL Council will report to BBRS the notification received from Massachusetts Federation the Town of Douglas notified the current Building Commissioner his position would be terminated December 31, 2018 and the town would then hire a 4 *Leaf*, *Inc*. in the place of Building Commissioner. According to Chapter 143 every city and town shall employ and designate an inspector of buildings as well as other local inspectors as are reasonable necessary.

- c. Scott Shippey, Building Commissioner Town of Marion, provided a statement regarding the on line PRONTO exams being offered by ICC, letter attached. Committee members had a discussion as to what other licenses issued by the Department of Professional Licensure allows exams to be taken on line and not at a testing facility?
- d. Discussion for Certification Committee building official association members to have an *alternate* when the member is not available. And to have a State Building Inspector, geographically, as an *alternate* for members at large.
- e. Michael Giampietro reported MFBO members, Joe Atchue, Fred Lonardo and Mike, are still researching a Mentoring Program for building inspectors.
