- f. Ongoing discussion regarding who the Appointing Authority is in a city or town. Acts of 802 clearly defined the Appointing Authority as the Mayor in a City or the Chairman in a Town. This was only law for a couple of years and was removed and broadened by the legislature. Research by Charles Kilb, General Council states the Chief Administrative Officer can be defined by the town through the town charter or by home rule petition. The city or town can basically define who the Appointing Authority is.
