- Likewise, the Committee noted BBRS needs to address if there is a general resolution on circumstances of when the IBC references the IFC. In the interim, the committee will continue to review and provide recommendations on such instances in Chapter 9. It is noted that in some cases it will be appropriate to remove the IFC reference and include 527 CMR 1.00. In other cases, it may be appropriate to simply bring the IFC language being referenced into the Chapter 9 amendments, so it is clear what the ultimate requirements are.

 - a. 2021 IBC Chapter 4 (FPFP Task #21-002.C4)
 - b. 2021 IBC fire protection provisions for exterior walls in Chapters 14 & 26 (FPFP Task #21-002.C14&C26).
 - c. 2021 IEBC fire protection provisions and Chapter 34 Committee review conclusions for conflicts or recommendations (FPFP Task #21-002.IEBC).
