May 26, 2021 Meeting Minutes

General notes on format of these minutes

- Agenda topics as numbered may be in the same order as they appear on the meeting agenda.
- The meeting agenda is listed as EXHIBIT A; others are listed sequentially as addresses during the meeting.

Regular Meeting Portion

- 1. Minutes. On a MOTION by Lee Cleveland, seconded by Jacob Nunnemacher, it was a unanimous vote to approve the draft meeting minutes for May 12, 2021, Existing Building Code Technical Advisory Committee (EAC) as amended (EXHIBIT B). The edits included adding a sentence to the Chapter 11 discussion that Dan Walsh would check with Rob Anderson about how the IBC will reference A117. Also, under Chapter 13, the discussion included tightening the values in Table 1301.6.3 would be a considerable undertaking, but making sure the section uses the MA definitions of fire alarm systems might be more manageable.
- 2. Review\Vote recommendations on the 2021 International Existing Building Code. The group decided to table Chapter 3. Next Chairman Mike DiMascio talked about Chapter 6 and the 2021 version striking reconfiguration of space in Section 603.1. He explained this likely happened because is part of the work area

definition. On a MOTION by Doug Anderson, seconded by Mike Grover, it was a unanimous vote to approve Chapter 6 (EXHIBIT C).

The group then discussed Chapter 10 and Dan Walsh explained how Rob Anderson is intending to recommend how reference to A117 should be handled in the IBC. He explained A117 is an accessibility standard and Mass uses 521 CMR and the 9th edition referrers the user to 521 CMR. There has not been any confusion and\or question with regard to how to apply 521 CMR when using\enforcing the ninth edition. The discussion included Section 1011.4 referrers to Section 808 in A117, an enhanced classroom acoustics requirement, some do not believe 521 CMR includes similar requirements. Kevin Hastings offered to check with AAB to see if 527 CMR include acoustic requirements, and Chairman Mike DiMascio offered to check with ICC about whether Section 808 is an accessibility requirement. The group decided to table Chapter 10 (EXHIBIT D).

Next the group discussed Chapter 13 and Chairman DiMascio talked about not experiencing people using the provisions to avoid installing fore sprinklers. Kerry Dietz talked about her experiences do not include using this section. Vernon mentioned it is an obsolete. Mike Grover spoke about making changes can cause unintentional problems but agrees with using MA definitions. Some members were going to look into fire alarm systems. The group tabled to hear back from Dana. (EXHIBIT E).

Chapter 14 was discussed next. The group discussed the requirements for a project involving moving a building and change the use the building has to meet the code for new construction. On a MOTION by Mike Grover, seconded by Doug Anderson, it was a unanimous vote to approve Chapter 14 (EXHIBIT F).

Next the group discussed Chapter 15. Jacob Nunnemacher talked about making sure the provisions in this chapter do not create conflict the fire prevention code and NFPA 241. Chairman Mike DiMascio asked for any issues or conflicts that anyone has. Jacob Nunnemacher offered to do a side by side comparison with NFPA 241 to identify conflicts. Doug Anderson talked about the protection of pedestrians and wondered if the provisions go far enough. The group decided to table until the June 23rd meeting.

- 3. Mike Grover talked about retiring at the end of this week and how he has enjoyed serving on the Committee for many years. He also spoke about how rewarding serving on the Committee has been. Many in the group thanked Mike for his service and spoke highly for his work on the Committee and his participation invaluable.
- 4. Doug Anderson talked about roof deck access for projects in Boston and the BCAB grants these requests. He spoke about changing the code for these to be by-right in the future.
- 5. Adjourn Session. On a MOTION by Mike Grover, seconded by Doug Anderson, it was unanimously VOTED by ROLL CALL to adjourn the meeting @ approximately 11:42 a.m.
