PREPAREDNESS FOR EXTREME WEATHER

Get started: Flooding can occur in any season and for many different reasons. This document provides the steps to prepare within 24 hours or less of a flood event to reduce the probability of your business being impacted by flooding. If you lease your commercial space, review this list with the owner/building manager.



- Your insurance policy doesn't cover flood damage and you must pay for repairs
- You're unable to access your business premises because of flooding
- Your building is damaged causing delay in business opening
- Your building loses power

## YOUR BUSINESS OPERATIONS

- Important documentation is damaged by flooding
- You aren't able to access internet-based point-of-• sale or data systems
- You aren't able to contact your staff
- Your staff isn't able to come to work because of transportation failure
- Supplies aren't delivered

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO REMAIN OPEN FOR BUSINESS -**BEFORE** DURING **AFTER** Review Extreme Weather Sign up for emergency Call the fire department if you feel you are at risk alerts Activate your business Avoid traveling continuity plan Deploy flood barriers or Do a periodic check of Rebuild with sandbags at low openings at-risk areas for flooding flood-resistant materials Clean storm drains around Accomodate staff on-site to support emergency property Develop/adjust business Raise important items Set all powered equipment continuity plan based on vulnerable to flooding to open/close position Make sure your emergency generator is operable Check sump pump Update your insurance policy to cover flooding \*Fill out blank spaces with actions specific to you
