DISFIGUREMENT OF EYE (k)

Enucleation	\$5,770.00
Loss of pupil or any prominent disruption of pupil.	\$2,100.00
Obvious change in iris of eye, such as prominent scar across iris or change in color.	\$3,145.00
Drooping eyelid, (Ptosis) quite prominent.	\$3,145.00

In any case where there is obvious disfigurement of the eye, payment should be quite high.

Ruptured Disc, linear scar, not discolored, \$140.00 per inch below waistline; \$175.00 per inch above waistline.

Ruptured Disc, discolored linear scar, \$175.00 per inch below waistline; \$215.00 per inch above waistline.

Ruptured Disc, wide and discolored scar, \$215.00 per inch below.waistline; \$265.00 per inch above waistline.

Scar on hip, donor site for spinal fusion, \$210.00

VENTRAL or UMBILICAL hernia scar, \$140.00 per inch; 1/2" wide, discolored or having stitch marks, \$265.00 per inch.

INGUINAL hernia scar, \$175.00
