CIRCULAR LETTER NO. 41

TO: ALL INSURERS, SELF-INSURERS, AND WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION AGENTS

RE: INFORMATION TO BE FURNISHED IN LONG INCAPACITY CASES.

Circular Letter #32 requires all insurers in all cases where incapacity compensation has been paid to the amount of \$4250.00 and weekly compensation payments are continuing, to notify the department immediately that payment of \$4250.00 has been made.

The obligation to give this notice to the Department is now placed on all self-insurers and workmen's compensation agents, and all insurers, self-insurers, and workmen's compensation agents are required, in such notice, to give the last known address of the employee or the address to which checks are being mailed.

On completion of payments of \$4500.00 in either Sections 34 or 35 or both, the employee's agreement to the discontinuance of compensation payment, signed or unsigned, must give the same information as to the address of the employee. This is an important requirement, and all concerned should arrange a procedure to make certain that notification is given promptly on each such case.
