What have been the surprises along the way so far, any changes to the project plan needed?

No changes to the project plan have been necessary. The only surprise along the way has been the need to plan for compensation to farmers for ongoing site maintenance beyond the project period, as well as the need for follow up soil and pollinator surveys to demonstrate the project's impact on soil health and pollinator diversity. For this reason, we have applied for the Healthy Soils Round 2 Grant.
