

Cape Cod Bridges Program Advisory Group Meeting October 22, 2024, 3-5 PM

Meeting Summary

The fourth meeting of the Cape Cod Bridges Project Advisory Group took place on October 22, 2024, at Mass Maritime Academy. At this meeting, the Project Team provided a brief presentation followed by a discussion. Topics include a funding update, NEPA update, overview and assessment of interchange options, and recommendations followed by a discussion and questions. Attendees included the Program Team, elected and appointed officials from the local, state, and federal levels, community organization leaders, and members of the public.

Meeting Notes

- 1. Program Team Presentation
 - Program updates were given by Bryan Cordeiro, MassDOT, Dave Anderson (HNTB), and Mark Kolonoski (HNTB).
- 2. Discussion and Comments
 - Roger Forget, Upper Cape Regional Technical School: Will the evaluation of intersection configurations be considered as it relates to community operations?
 - o Bryan Cordeiro, MassDOT: The project team is assessing this.
 - Susan Moran, State Senator: Has there been or will there be an analysis of an HOV lane on the Sagamore Bridge?
 - o Bryan Cordeiro, MassDOT: A HOV lanes are not being considered.
 - Mary Ann Smith, Upper Cape Regional Technical School: What will be the construction period's effects on Upper Tech's driveways?
 - Bryan Cordeiro, MassDOT: The goal is to keep two lanes open during all of construction. There will be no lane closures.
 - Mary Ann Smith, Upper Cape Regional Technical School: There are concerns about how long students can be on the bus.
 - James: We understand and appreciate this concern and are continuing to evaluate and work to minimize impacts.
 - Allen Phillips, MEMA: Will MassDOT consider creating a Public Safety Sub-Committee?
 - o Bryan Cordeiro, MassDOT: MassDOT will discuss this idea.
 - Steve Tupper, Cape Cod Metropolitan Planning Organization: Question regarding traffic analysis.
 - o Alex Sui, HNTB: Some traffic analysis has been performed.
 - Marlene McCollem, Town of Bourne: Have people with potential takings been notified?



- Dave Anderson, HNTB: MassDOT expects to receive early notification approval from FHWA in the coming months.
- John York, Member of the Public: Will there be multimodal routes at Sagamore North?
 - Jill McLaughlin, Stantec: It is being considered in the current design and the team is continuing to refine this topic.
- Steve Buckley, Member of the Public: What is the status of NEPA and scoping report?
 - Mark Kolonoski, HNTB: Provided the timeline of events related to NEPA and scoping.
 - o Steven Buckley, Member of the Public: Will this process be documented?
 - Mark Kolonoski, HNTB: This process has been documented.
- Sean Reardon (Massachusetts State Police): How will the police barracks be located with respect to access to the bridge?
 - Bryan Cordeiro, MassDOT: The State Police barracks will retain access to the bridge.
- Marlene McCollem, Town of Bourne: Is there a Plan B for funding the Bourne Bridge.
 - Bryan Cordeiro, MassDOT: It is being discussed with MassDOT leadership to put together another plan which will include seeking federal funding sources.
- Marlene McCollem, Bourne Town Administrator: What is the procurement plan and is the \$350 million included in the budget for the USACE?
 - Bryan Cordeiro, MassDOT: The \$350 million in funding would be utilized by Eastern Federal Lands which means that Eastern Federal Lands would be part of procurement and oversight.
- Marlene McCollem, Bourne Town Administrator: Will there be two contracts for Sagamore?
 - Bryan Cordeiro, MassDOT: MassDOT is looking into this topic. The cost and schedule risk assessment showed that there could potentially be a lack of bidders. One way to reduce that is to break up the program into smaller packages. This is an ongoing analysis.
- Paul Niedzwiecki, Cape Cod Chamber of Commerce: Question regarding funding.
 - Dave Anderson, HNTB: The Program cannot request more than 50% BIP funding. MassDOT hasn't been formally notified and thus doesn't know all the feedback of the application.
