

A Revised Direction for FY 21


- The FY21 CIP will represent a one-year "maintenance of effort" plan in response to the current pandemic.
- For MassDOT/MBTA, this would have been the last year of rolling 5-year CIP. FY22-26 plan will now be a "reset" plan
- Focus is on continuing investments already underway and those that had been planned to start in FY21
 - Consistent with FY21 projects anticipated in year 2 of approved FY20-24 CIP
 - Any changes are the result of project-specific concerns, not budgetary issues
 - Does not assume new funding sources or new programs not currently authorized/funded
- The FY21 Plan maintains the priorities and strategies for MassDOT/MBTA to invest first in the reliability and modernization of our system with targeted investments in increasing capacity of the network and providing access to new transportation
 - Proposed investments in reliability and modernization of the network account for approximately 73% of our programmed spending in 2021
- The public review of the "maintenance of effort" CIP will be done through six virtual regional meetings

CIP and State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) alignment

- STIP is dedicated to federal funding and federally funded transportation projects and is subject to federal approval
 - Comprised almost exclusively of roadway and public transit projects
 - Includes projects programmed by the 13 Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs)
- STIP makes use of the priorities/programs/projects framework similar to the CIP framework
- CIP project spending is consistent with projects programmed in the STIP
 - MPOs have been meeting virtually to revise TIPs and STIP
- CIP identifies all of the sources and uses of transportation funding available
- CIP also includes state capital funding for projects advanced by MassDOT and the MBTA, including Rail and Transit, Aeronautics Division, and the Registry of Motor Vehicles

Two ways to advance projects in the CIP:

- MassDOT/Local planning & prioritization processes
- MPO planning & prioritization processes



CIP Strategic investment focus

- The plan, including federal, state and toll revenue, maintains the focus on:
 - Roadway assets in need of investment: roads/pavement, bridges, the Metropolitan Highway System and bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure
 - MBTA capital needs for reliability/modernization, balanced with expansion investments
 - Municipal needs addressed through reimbursement and grant programs such as Chapter 90, Complete Streets, and Municipal Bridge
- The FY21 CIP projects \$3.7 billion in estimated spending
 - \$1.9 billion for MassDOT investments
 - \$1.75 billion for MBTA investments
- We will begin process of developing full 5-year plan later in 2020, when state and federal legislative/funding picture is clearer



CIP Strategic investments: MBTA

- MBTA investments continue to focus on:
 - Investments to existing lines:
 - Red Line/Orange Line Improvements and Vehicles
 - Commuter Rail Positive Train Control and Automatic Train Control
 - Green Line Transformation including Type 10 Vehicle Procurement
 - Blue Line Harbor Tunnel Infrastructure Improvements

Investments in bus system

- Delivery of 194 Hybrid buses; overhaul of 155 New Flyer Buses
- Bus Stop accessibility and bus network improvements, include transit priority
- Bus maintenance facility improvements and modernization

Service improvements and development oriented investments

- Fare Transformation
- Commuter Rail Bi-Level Coaches
- South Station Tower 1 Early Action Project

New Service:

- Green Line Extension
- South Coast Rail




CIP Strategic investments: Municipal

- Municipal needs are addressed by three existing state-funded programs
 - FY 20 Chapter 90 (programmed at \$200 million/year with an additional \$20 million allocated by the Commonwealth from surplus operating funds;
 - \$200 million assumed for FY 21
 - Complete Streets (148 municipal grants totaling \$46 million since 2016)
 - Municipal Small Bridges (93 small grants totaling \$45 million since 2016)
- In addition, larger municipal projects are programmed into the State Transportation Investment Program (STIP) by the regional Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs)



Overview FY21 projects – Boston Region


In general, the FY 21 plan looks very similar to last year's CIP



FY21 Plan: virtual interactive format and public engagement

- Similar to last year the CIP document will be presented as a virtual "story map," providing users the opportunity to interact with the CIP content and comment on specific projects
- Unlike last year there will be no in-person public outreach meetings
- In lieu of in-person public meetings, MassDOT/MBTA has organized six virtual regional public meetings that will be hosted by the respective Metropolitan Organizations (MPOs)
- The presentation for each of the meetings will provide a brief overview of the CIP and focus on the 2021 investments in that particular region
 - Public comment will be accepted as part of the virtual public meeting and is also encouraged via the online public comment tool
 - While each meeting will focus on a specific region, comments will be accepted on any aspect of the CIP



Plan update: engagement for draft FY21 CIP


- 6 virtual public meetings across the Commonwealth to be held in collaboration with the Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs)

CIP Online Comment Tool

- The CIP online comment tool and interactive map allows users to view and provide comments on every project included in the draft CIP. General, non-project specific comments may also be submitted.
- Users can filter projects by MassDOT Division, municipality, MPO region, CIP program, and cost. Users can also search for projects by name and enter their address to view nearby projects.
