
Early Childhood Career Pathways Grant



What is the Career Pathways Grant?


The Early Childhood Career Pathways Grant is a workforce development grant between EEC and the 15 public community colleges in Massachusetts.

Each college is awarded a grant to build the early childhood workforce through college funded courses. The colleges use this funding to provide academic services to educators, including coursework, textbooks, tutoring, mentoring, technology and other student support services.

Am I eligible for Career Pathways services?

Career Pathways students must:

- Have an active account in <u>EEC's Professional Qualifications Registry</u>(PQR)
- Live and work in Massachusetts
- Be employed for at least 20 hrs/wk at an EEC licensed or funded program OR intend to begin working an an EEC licensed or funded program within 6 months, OR be a recent or near future graduate of a high school EEC program
- Agree to the terms and conditions of participation, including: completing course and or college application, participate in supports necessary for success, remaining employed during participation in the course(s), agreeing to remain in the field for at least 1 year after completion, sharing demographic data for the purposes of reporting
- Other requirements as requested by the college (For example: high school diploma, good financial/academic standing, application to the college)



How do I get started?

You can start the process by choosing a community college. Keep in mind:



Proximity: Choose a college that is close to where you live or work so you can access in-person classes and services like the library and tutoring center.



Previous Coursework: If you've already taken classes at a community college, return to that college.



Language Needs: If you need classes in a language other than English, select a college that offers the language you need.



Then what?

Now that you have chosen a community college you are ready to get enrolled!



Send an email to the Career Pathways Grant Coordinator at the community college of your choice.



There will be several steps to take for course registration. Watch your email for a reply from the Grant Coordinator (please check your email regularly).



Have any previous college transcripts available upon request from the Grant Coordinator to determine eligibility for enrollment and to identify course selection.

Important Things to Remember!

As you plan out your next steps keep in mind:



You may be asked for a copy of your high school diploma or college transcript.



Reach out to only one college at a time.



Return to a college where you've already taken classes.



Classes start at the beginning of each semester: September, January & May. Classes are not offered "on demand."



Before you enroll, prepare by making sure you understand the time commitment needed for coursework (both in and outside of the classroom). Review each course description, mark your calendar with important due dates and registration deadlines, and seek assistance from the grant coordinator as needed.
