Proceedings

Chair Ginnis called the meeting to order at 3:05 pm, noting that all votes taken during the meeting would be conducted via roll call. Members briefly introduced themselves.

<u>Vote I to approve the 12/17/2020 minutes</u>: Chair Ginnis requested a motion to approve the minutes from the Commission's previous meeting on December 17, 2020. Ms. Diaz-Linhart introduced the motion, which was seconded by Professor Hannah and approved by roll-call vote (see detailed record of votes above).

Gabe Cohen provided an update on the submission of the Commission's annual report, which was submitted to the Legislature in March 2021. For additional details, refer to the report, which has been posted to the Community Behavioral Health Commission's <u>Meeting Materials webpage</u>.

Chair Ginnis led a discussion of the recommendations developed by the Commission subcommittee formed at the October 15, 2020 meeting with the goal of exploring promotion and prevention-related recommendations to address the impact of the pandemic on the behavioral health of children and families, with a focus on the disproportionate impact of COVID-19 on communities of color and low-resource communities. Members discussed each of the proposed recommendations, promoting a centralized message with a decentralized approach.
