DECISION

RONIT HOSPITALITY II LLC D/B/A RADISSON HOTEL & SUITES
10 INDEPENDENCE DR.
CHELMSFORD, MA 01824

Ronit Hospitality II LLC d/b/a Radisson Hotel & Suites (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, § 12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, November 29, 2016, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Bailey's Report.

The Commission took Administrative Notice of the Licensee's record.

FACTS


1. On Thursday, May 26, 2016, at approximately 6:23 p.m., Investigators Doyle and Bailey ("Investigators") investigated the business operation of Ronit Hospitality II LLC d/b/a Radisson Hotel & Suites.

2. An underage operative, working with Investigators, purchased from the Licensee an alcoholic beverage, a bottle of Budweiser Light beer, for four dollars and twenty-eight cents (\$4.28). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence the Commission finds the Licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission **suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.**
