

2024 Climate Act Proposed Regulations Public Comment Hearings

The Massachusetts Energy Facilities Siting Board (EFSB) invites you to attend one or both hybrid public comment hearings (with in person and remote participation options) to learn about implementing the siting and permitting changes required by the 2024 Climate Act for energy facilities, and to provide oral comments. These two hearings are related to Cumulative Impact Analysis and Standards for Applying Site Suitability Criteria. The Cumulative Impact Analysis is a process to evaluate existing environmental burdens and related public health consequences in an area near a proposed energy project, and to assess whether the project would result in environmental and public health impacts. Site Suitability is a process to determine the suitability of sites for large and small clean energy generation facilities and large and small energy storage facilities.

The EFSB will conduct two hybrid public comment hearings on Monday, February 2, 2026 at the offices of the Department of Public Utilities, One South Station, Boston, MA 02110, 3rd floor, Large Hearing Room. Each public comment hearing will begin with a presentation of the proposed regulations followed by an opportunity for people to ask questions and provide comments.
