

Mr. James Stanton:

I have had access to the pro se cases in Sup Ct in Hampden County as set up by Tahiva Williams predecessor (my number in the older system is #####, with password #####). I had written Tashiva Williams several weeks ago and she said that the Trial Court Information Services now handled it, subject to the Trial Court's Governance Committee on Public Access. I have just found the email address for the Committee and am contacting you in those regards.

I tried again today to get onto the new system which is closed to only attorneys even though the Superior Court Department had initially reviewed my situation and permitted the exceptional access to the online docket in their system prior to the new changeover in Hampden County. My wife and I are 72, in ill health, have great difficulty with transportation in order to go to the Springfield Superior Court to check the docket so as to check and timely maintain my actions against three banks (HSBC, Midfirst Bank & Midland Bank) all represented by counsel with access to the online docket daily. Particularly at this critical time, without this timely access and information I could inadvertently default or fail to make a filing or take some required action in a timely manner. There was a hearing in the consolidated cases and various orders have or are being issued.

As mentioned above, we are at a particularly critical time in the litigation, with orders having issued pursuant to hearing of early June and more to follow. There is also a possibility that timely transfer to the Housing Court may be a necessity and we will not be able to accomplish that in a timely manner if we do not have the past access to the docket. Please let us know what we can do as soon as possible.
