



Commonwealth Critical Infrastructure Program

Program Background

The Commonwealth Critical Infrastructure Program (CCIP) was created in 2005 to implement a statewide, coordinated approach to the identification and protection of critical infrastructure in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. The CCIP is a component of the Commonwealth Fusion Center (CFC).

The CCIP’s mission is to identify, prioritize, and protect Massachusetts’ critical infrastructure. It serves as the Protected Critical Infrastructure Information (PCII) Coordinator for the state, creates and disseminates critical infrastructure related intelligence products to public sector and private sector contacts, and responds to requests pertaining to critical infrastructure. The CCIP also participates in the Commonwealth’s Threats and Hazards Identification Risk Assessment (THIRA) process, conducts critical infrastructure risk assessments, and oversees the annual DHS data call related to hundreds of special events that occur each year throughout the Commonwealth.

Intelligence Products & Analysis

The CCIP provides timely, concise, and relevant intelligence analysis.

It also re-disseminates intelligence and other important information received from various partners. Disseminated intelligence products include:

- Infrastructure Protection Information Bulletins – Brief bulletins that highlight significant trends, threats, or vulnerabilities with implications for critical infrastructure owners.
- Pass-Through Information-Alerts, advisories, bulletins and more that are from various sources, such as federal, state and local partners, Fusion Centers, Information Sharing and Analysis Centers, or private sector partners.
