		Why is a Clinical Formulation – Interpretive Summary required?	Federal Rehab Option regulations require that determination of need for rehabilitative services be established by a Licensed Practitioner for the Healing Arts (LPHA) in order for the Commonwealth to seek reimbursement for these services. The Clinical Formulation – Interpretive Summary must be completed by the Licensed Practitioner of the Healing Arts (LPHA). This is part of the Comprehensive Assessment. If a master's level clinician without a license develops the clinical formulation, an LPHA must review and sign.
What are the guidelines for the completion of the Clinical Formulation – Interpretive Summary?	The Clinical Formulation portion of the comprehensive assessment is not a duplication of earlier content from the assessment, but a summary and analysis that blends the findings and opinions of the assessor(s) with the preferences of the youth/family into a concise and clear synthesis. It establishes the need for treatment/rehabilitative services and provides a clear rationale for why some, but not necessarily all, assessed needs have priority status for the person's treatment plan goal development.		
	<ul> <li>A concise formulation includes the following: <ul> <li>A brief (one-two sentence) summary identifying the youth and family and describing the current reason(s) for ICS services.</li> <li>Identified needs</li> <li>For each identified need, briefly describe the: <ul> <li>origin and contributing factors;</li> <li>how the need limits community functioning;</li> <li>barriers to making progress toward resolving the need;</li> <li>supports and strengths present that will promote progress toward resolving the need.</li> </ul> </li> </ul></li></ul>		
If a new need (not previously assessed) is identified, is a new clinical formulation/interpretive summary required?	Yes, an updated clinical formulation interpretive summary needs to be completed to include the new need area.		
	Note: The Clinical Formulation must be completed annually, at minimum.		

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
