Condencia Brade has spent over 20 years working on behalf of sexual assault survivors, particularly women, youths and children of color. She is passionate about the importance of culturally specific responses and the critical value of culturally specific Communities of Color organizations addressing domestic violence and sexual assault. Condencia is the co-founder and former Executive Director of the National Organization of Sisters of Color Ending Sexual Assault (SCESA). SCESA is an advocacy organization of Women of Color working to create a just society in which all Women of Color are able to live healthy lives free of violence.

Throughout her career, Condencia has worked to ensure that national, state, and local policies are responsive to the needs of communities of color. She began her career working in public health and then on to higher education. Condencia has worked at a statewide anti-sexual assault coalition; implemented statewide training initiatives for law enforcement and healthcare providers; created a national initiative responding to violence against women at Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs); and an initiative addressing violence against women in the US Territories. Condencia has provided training and technical assistance on women of color leadership, supporting youths and girls of color, immigration, economics, healthcare, housing and culturally relevant responses addressing sexual assault to governmental agencies, corporations, foundations, and international, national, state, territorial and community based organizations.
