Please note- I speak from experience. We recently purchased and gut-renovated our current house, at great expense. Despite repeated inquiries, our contractor did NOT respond to requests for information concerning solar panel installation, did NOT suggest a heat-pump, did NOT install an efficient whole-house fan (a very low cost alternative to air-conditioning) etc. While he did put in decent insulation, he clearly wasn't interested in saving maximum energy- among other things he did was install an EIGHTY (80 !!!) gallon water heater for a small family, without asking. Why so large? I've no idea. By the time I became aware of options it was too late. But if required by law, I'm sure he could have done better.....
