EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Timely and prompt case processing are key components in the Trial Court's mission and vision of the justice system. First implemented in 2006, case flow metrics reporting began as an initiative to collect statistics on case processing efforts across the Massachusetts Trial Court. Today, the results of metrics are used by court leaders to further improve court operations and services in user experience and resource allocation.

This report presents a year-over-year comparison of performance in the following case flow metrics:

Clearance Rate

A measure of outgoing cases to the number of incoming cases.

Time to Disposition

The rate of cases disposed or resolved within established time standards.

Age of Pending Cases

A measure of active, pending cases that are beyond the disposition date set by the time standards.

Event Date Certainty

A measure of events resulted to events held.

EVENT DATE CERTAINTY


The Trial Court implemented a new performance metric to track court performance in the scheduling of matters. During the pandemic, the capacity to hold case events became an important factor in a court's ability to reduce backlog. Adapted from the National Center for State Court's Trial Date Certainty metric, Event Date Certainty measures the number of events resulted to the number of events held before the court. There are reasons an event may be resulted but not held, including but not limited to, by request of a litigant or attorney, by agreement to an informal resolution, or for emergency or weather-related matters. Our hope with the implementation of this new metric is that it allows for more insight into best practices for scheduling matters across the Trial Court.

RESULTS

The results of the case flow metrics show that the Trial Court's efforts to return to pre-pandemic case processing are within reach:

- New metric case filings increased by 11.2% from FY 2021 to FY 2022, from 574,710 to 638,886.
- In FY 2022, the Trial Court rescinded certain pandemic protocols which increased capacity to dispose of cases. The number of cases disposed of in FY 2022 increased by 44.7% over FY 2021.
- The clearance rate surpassed 100% at years-end for the first time since FY 2017. The FY 2022 rate was 23.4 percentage points higher than the FY 2021 clearance rate of 77.6%. A rate over 100% indicates a court has been disposing of its pending caseload.
- Because the Trial Court is disposing of older back-logged cases, time to disposition is longer for more recently disposed cases. Time to disposition dropped 3.7% to 63.0% in FY 2022.
- Pending cases totaled 358,037 while pending cases beyond time standards totaled 190,104. FY 2022 figures represent a drop of 21.3% in pending cases, and a 32.5% drop in cases pending beyond time standards. The pending caseload peaked in FY 2021 as a result of the pandemic and COVID-19 precautions.
- The percent of cases pending beyond time standards reduced from 62.0% in FY 2021 to 53.1% in FY 2022.
- Over 1.2 million events were held before the court, almost a 20% increase from last year. The event date certainty rate increased to 65.5% from 58.0% in FY 2021.



Time to Disposition









