On September 18, 2014, the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) held a public meeting at the Shriners Hospital for Children to present a draft Resource Management Plan (RMP) for the Charles River Esplanade-New Basin Complex, extending from Boston Harbor to the Boston University Bridge. In addition to presenting the draft RMP, DCR announced a public comment period, which has been extended through the close of business on Friday, October 31. 2014.
