I, the undersigned counsel for the above-named defendant in the above-captioned case, certify that with regard to the waiver of the right to jury trial, I have explained the following to the defendant:			
That in a jury trial the jury consists of members of the community;			
That the defendant may participate in the selection;			
That the verdict of the jury must be unanimous;			
That the jury decides whether the Commonwealth has proved beyond a reasonable doubt that the defendant is guilty, while the judge makes rulings of law in the course of the trial, instructs the jury on the law, and determines the sentence if the defendant is convicted; and			
That if the defendant waives the right to jury trial, then the judge alone decides whether the Commonwealth has proved beyond a reasonable doubt that the defendant is guilty, in accordance with the facts and the law.
