CTTF Legislative Mandate: Our Work To Date

... Review the current means of (i) identifying school-aged children who have experienced trauma, particularly undiagnosed trauma, and (ii) providing services to help children recover from the psychological damage caused by such exposure to violence, crime or maltreatment.


The task force shall consider the feasibility of providing school-based trainings on early, trauma-focused interventions, trauma-informed screenings and assessments, and the recognition of reactions to victimization, as well as the necessity for diagnostic tools.

A priority shall be placed on juvenile or youthful offender's **pathways into the juvenile justice system** with the goal of reducing the likelihood of recidivism by addressing the unique issues associated with juvenile or youthful offenders ...

CTTF 2024-2025 Work Plan: Building a TIR Commonwealth






1. Governance models that focus on trauma and/or resilience

Spotlight 1: California's Master Plan for Kids' Mental Health

- Five-year plan to increase children's behavioral health supports (ages 0-25) across state government
- \$4.7 billion investment
- Across sectors:
 - School BH services
 - Workforce development
 - Increased insurance coverage
 - Public campaign to destigmatize MH concerns



Spotlight 2: New Jersey's Trauma-Focused Governance Efforts

As part of its Statewide PACEs Action Plan, in 2018 NJ DCF established four "transformational offices" to focus on prevention:

- Office of Family Voice
- Office of Diversity, Equity, and Belonging
- Office of Staff Health & Wellness
- Office of Resilience
 - Achieve trauma-informed and healing -centered state designation
 - Conduct a PACEs public awareness and mobilization campaign
 - Maintain community-driven policy and funding priorities
 - Provide cross-sector PACEs training
 - Promote trauma-foused services and supports



Spotlight 3: West Virginia's Handle With Care



- Simple 3-part program:
 - 1. HWC notice (child's name, age, school). The notice goes to child's teacher, school nurse, and counselor (*not* in child's record).
 - 2. Creating trauma-sensitive classrooms
 - 3. Therapy services on-site at school
- Now implemented in at least 7 other states (Massachusetts, Ohio, Virginia, Maryland, Colorado, Michigan, Florida)





- More to come!






Building a TIR Workforce

- CCWT and EEC are partnering to promote TIR education and foster resilience in EEC settings:
 - Six-module series through LMS for all EEC educators
 - Train-the-trainer series for PDC Academy with deep dives on select trauma-related topics
 - Training for EEC licensing specialists
- Goals of these professional development opportunities:
 - Define trauma and resilience, and understand their impact on childhood development
 - Identify common signs of trauma in young children
 - Learn concrete TIR strategies to implement the Guiding Principles in early education and child care programs
