Welcome to DCR's Cutler Park Reservation

Offering 700 acres of park land, Cutler Park, which is primarily marsh, attracts over 100 species of birds making it a prime spot for birding. The park is primarily used for hiking, mountain biking, fishing and canoeing.

It is part of the Massachusetts state park system and is managed by the Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR), an agency of the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs. DCR oversees 450,000 acres of parks, forests, beaches, bike trails, waterbodies, and dams. Its mission is to protect, promote, and enhance the state's natural, cultural, and recreational resources. - VISITOR GUIDELINES**
AT CUTLER PARK
- The park is open dawn to dusk.
 - Dogs must be leashed and waste removed.
 - Mountain biking allowed on established trails from April 15 to December 31.
 - Visitors must abide by park signage.
- THE FOLLOWING IS PROHIBITED**
- Motorized vehicles
 - Hunting or trapping
 - Fires
 - Alcoholic beverages
 - Removal of any park resource
