### Princeton University says database containing donor, alumni info breached

Information including names, email addresses, telephone numbers, and home and business addresses is stored on the database, in addition to donation information.



### Logitech discloses data breach after Clop claims

The filing comes one week after the Clop cybercriminal organization claimed it stole information from Logitech through a zero-day vulnerability in Oracle's E-Business Suite tool.



### Pennsylvania attorney general says SSNs stolen during August ransomware attack

Social Security numbers and medical information were among the data stolen in an August breach of the networks of Pennsylvania's attorney general, officials said.

### Full renewal of state and local cyber grants program passes in House

The PILLAR Act, which would renew federal cybersecurity grants to state and local governments for 10 years, passed by voice vote in the House.

The alert identifies two specific LinkedIn profiles, featuring fake personas, that are being used by China's Ministry of State Security in an attempt to build relationships in Westminster and gain intelligence.

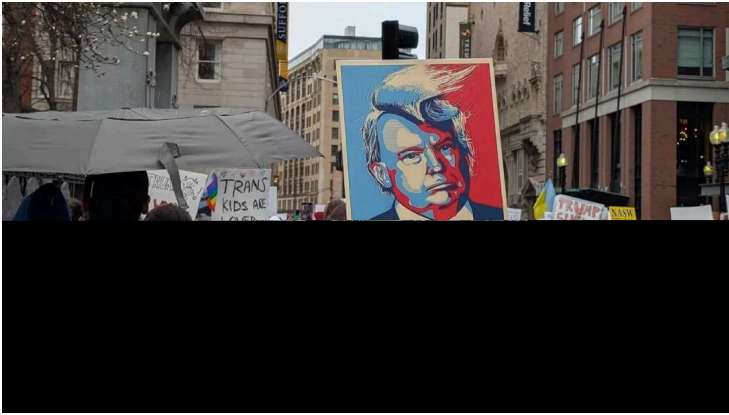




New Android malware can capture private messages, researchers warn

The malware can monitor everything displayed on a phone in real time — including contacts, full message threads and the content of encrypted chats — by accessing data after it has been decrypted by legitimate apps.



Flock Safety cameras used to monitor protesters, rights group finds

Police departments across the country searched records from Flock Safety's network of automated license plate reader cameras hundreds of times to track protest activity, researchers found.

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
