PLAINTIFF'S MOTION TO STAY ENFORCEMENT OF THE CIVIL SERVICE  
 COMMISSION'S DECISION GRANTING DEFENDANT, PETER CYRUS, RELIEF

Pursuant to Mass. R. Civ. P. 65 and G.L. c.30A §14(3), the Plaintiff, Town of Tewksbury and Tewksbury Police Department, moves for this Honorable Court to stay enforcement of the Decision and Order of the Civil Service Commission in the underlying matter of Peter Cyrus v. Tewksbury Police Department, Commission Docket No. G1-08-107, which is the subject of the pending petition for judicial review.

The Plaintiff further moves to enjoin the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Human Resources Division from placing Mr. Cyrus' name at the top of any current certification list and/or the next certification list from which the next original appointment to the position of Tewksbury Police Officer shall be made. In support thereof, the Plaintiffs refer to the attached memorandum of Law.

*I have reviewed the Commission's decision and the DHCRA  
 decision. I find a substantive likelihood of a judicial review will be  
 decided the Commission exceeded its authority and substituted its judgment  
 for the Appointing Authority. The harm to the public interest is an inappropriate  
 candidate is hired as a police officer, is greater than the harm to Mr. Cyrus  
 if his appointment is DENIED. Motion for Stay is ALLOWED*
