On the evenings of Wednesday, October 14, and Thursday, October 15, the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) held virtual public meetings to present, and obtain public input on, a proposal to expand the use of parking collections to include curbside meters along certain parkways and parking areas in the Metropolitan Boston area.
