As you know, on the evenings of Wednesday, October 14, and Thursday, October 15, the Department of Conservation and Recreation recently held public meetings to present, and obtain public input on, a proposal to expand the use of parking collections to include curbside meters along certain parkways and parking areas in the Metropolitan Boston area.

A number of questions were raised at the meetings, which we have addressed through a "Frequently Asked Questions" document, posted on DCR's website, along with the presentation shared, at https://www.mass.gov/event/massachusettsdepartment-of-conservation-and-recreation-curbside-parking-meter-proposal-2020. In addition, as requested, the Harvard Kennedy School revenue study has been posted, as well.
