General Information

What is the Park Passport Challenge and how does it work?

The Park Passport Challenge is an exciting program designed to encourage visitors to explore a variety of parks by completing fun tasks and collecting stamps. Participants will receive a Park Passport Challenge brochure that includes **12 featured DCR parks**, **2** from each of the **5 regions** as well as the **2 water supply** locations. At each park, participants will have the opportunity to complete optional engaging activities and collect a unique stamp to mark their visit. The goal is to inspire adventure, learning, and exploration of our beautiful natural landscapes.

How do I participate?

- 1. Pick up your Park Passport Brochure from a participating locations visitor center or print out our one-page passport at home.
- 2. Visit participating parks and find the hidden stamp box and stamp your passport to mark your adventure!
- 3. (optional) Complete the activities for more fun and print out the Additional Activities page to extend your adventure!
- 4. Gather as many stamps as you can to complete the Park Passport Challenge and redeem your prize! Complete the Park Passport Challenge and submit the redemption form by **November 30th, 2025**, to be entered into a raffle for a chance to win another exclusive prize!

Is the program free?

Yes, participation in the Park Passport Challenge is **free**. There is no cost to receive a passport, visit the stamp boxes, or to complete the activities. However, some parks may have parking fees or additional costs for other amenities, so it is a good idea to check the specific park's webpage before visiting.

Who can participate?

The program is open to everyone! It's designed to be as accessible as possible and is made to be engaging for people of all ages, backgrounds, and abilities.

Is there an end date to the Park Passport Challenge?

November 30, 2025 is the deadline to complete the Park Passport Challenge and submit your redemption form for your Park Passport Challenge water bottle sticker and to be entered into a raffle for a grand prize. Water bottle stickers will be mailed out within 3 weeks of submitting your redemption form. Grand prize winners will be selected and notified through a drawing in December 2025.

What should I bring to prepare for my visit?

Being prepared will help you make the most out of your visit! Consider bringing the following items:

- Your Park Passport Brochure to collect stamps
- Comfortable walking or hiking shoes
- Water and snacks to stay hydrated and energized
- Sun protection, including sunscreen, a hat, and sunglasses
- Bug spray to fend off the mosquitos and other insects
- A camera or binoculars to view the wildlife
- A map of the park to help you find your way

How to Participate and Track your Progress

Where can I get a Park Passport Challenge Brochure?

You can pick up a Park Passport Challenge Brochure at any participating park's visitor center. To find out which parks offer the brochure, visit our webpage at www.mass.gov/info-details/dcr-park-passport-challenge. You can also print a one-page passport sheet (8.5x11) at home or at a local library to take along on your adventure.

How do I collect stamps?

Once you arrive at a park, locate the stamp box, which is usually near the visitor center or other accessible areas. Use the secret code corresponding to the park's region in your Park Passport to unlock the box, then stamp your Park Passport Challenge Brochure in the space provided for that park.

What if I can't find the stamp box?

If you are having trouble finding a stamp box, check the park map and search near the entrance of the park, its visitor center, a kiosk, or along an accessible trail. If you are still unsure, ask a park ranger for assistance.

Do I have to visit all the parks?

No! You're welcome to visit as many or as few parks as you like. The program is designed to be flexible so that you can explore at your own pace. Whether you're focused on collecting stamps, completing activities, or extending your adventure with the Bonus Activities Page, it's all up to you! You must visit all 12 parks and obtain all 12 stamps to be eligible for the Park Passport Challenge water bottle sticker and to be entered into a raffle for an exclusive grand prize.

Where can I get the bonus activities page?

You can download a digital version of the Bonus Activities (optional) page from our Park Passport Challenge webpage at www.mass.gov/info-details/dcr-park-passport-challenge. You can print it out at home or at your local library.

Rewards

Is there a prize for completing the challenge?

Yes! Participants who complete the Park Passport Challenge by collecting **all 12** stamps will be eligible to receive a special prize – a Park Passport Challenge water bottle sticker! Those who complete the challenge and submit their redemption form by **November 30, 2025,** will be entered into a raffle for a chance to win an exclusive grand prize!

How do I redeem my prize?

Once you've gathered **all 12** stamps, visit our webpage and fill out the on-line prize redemption form. You should expect to receive your water bottle sticker within **3 weeks** of submitting your form. To be entered into a raffle for a chance to win another prize, submit your on-line prize redemption form by **November 30, 2025.**

Accessibility and Inclusion

Are the parks accessible for individuals with disabilities?

Yes, the Park Passport Challenge is designed to be inclusive and accessible for people of all abilities. Stamp boxes are placed in easily accessible areas, and the locks are designed for easy use by individuals with different physical abilities.

Are service animals allowed at the parks?

Yes, service animals are welcome at all participating parks. Please be sure to follow parkspecific guidelines regarding other pets.

Note: Dogs are NOT allowed at Walden Pond State Reservation, Quabbin Reservoir, or Wachusett Reservoir at any time, other than service animals.

What languages is the program available in?

The program is available in **11 languages** including English to make the program as inclusive as possible. Translated versions of the Park Passport Challenge brochure and other essential materials are available in:

Where can I get translated versions of the Park Passport Challenge brochure and other essential materials?

All 12 participating parks will have physical copies of the Park Passport Challenge brochure and other essential materials available in **11 languages** including English. We recommend calling ahead to ensure that the park has the materials in stock. If any park is temporarily out of copies, the materials will be ordered and made available as soon as possible.

Technical Issues

What if I lose my Park Passport Challenge Brochure?

Don't worry! You can pick up a new Park Passport Challenge brochure at any participating park. If you lost your stamps, you may still redeem your prize by visiting our webpage and filling out the prize redemption form.

How do I report an issue with stamp box materials?

If you encounter any issues with a stamp box, let a park staff know, or by emailing **DCRPassport@mass.gov**. Please include the name of the park and describe the issue, and we'll work to resolve it promptly.

Who do I contact with further questions?

If you have questions, feel free to ask park staff for assistance. If they're unable to answer your question, you can submit your question or concern by emailing **DCRPassport@mass.gov**. We aim to respond to all inquiries in a timely manner.
