Jim Montgomery informed the Council on/of the following matters:

- April saw a secretariat-wide celebration of Earth Week
 - Commissioner Roy and Brockton Mayor Bill Carpenter attended a ceremonial treeplanting to mark the start of the DCR's 2017 Greening the Gateway Cities Program
 - Governor Baker, Secretary Beaton and Commissioner Roy joined to cut the ribbon on Phase I of the Muddy River Restoration project
- This past Saturday, DCR held its 11th annual Park Serve Day
- Family friendly programming was offered throughout the state parks system during school vacation week
- DCR also announced the opening of the Quabbin Reservoir Fishing Season on April 12th
- Commissioner Roy held a "Coffee with the Commissioner" listening session with South Region employees at Myles Standish, and a meeting with Boston-area staff is being rescheduled

- The Tennessee Gas Pipeline Co. started work on a pipeline through Otis State Forest
- Throughout May, the DCR will be marking National Preservation Month with various educational programming that will bring visitors on guided hikes, tours through historic buildings, and other activities to learn more about how DCR protects Massachusetts's heritage.

- A decision on an ice rink for the South Shore to be made in the next several weeks, and staff is currently preparing to hold one or more public meetings to inform the residents of Canton and Norwood about the winning design and where this new facility will be situated
