Volunteers in the Parks

- Program sits in the Visitor Experience and Programming unit.
- Overseen by Manager of Stewardship Programs and Strategic Initiatives who reports to Director of Visitor Experience and Programs.
- Coordinates the Volunteers in the Parks Program which was established in 2014 with the publishing of the "Volunteers in Parks Program Guide."
- Oversees annual Park Serve Day event.

Park Serve Day

- Annual Day of Stewardship that coincides with Earth Week
- 40 participating parks and 60 separate events held.
- 2000 volunteers
- 4000 hours worked
- 14,000 lbs of trash collected

Current Volunteer Program

Volunteering at DCR Parks is popular amongst corporate groups, non-profits, and individuals looking to give back to the spaces that they enjoy. There are several different ways that someone can volunteer in a park:

- Contacting DCR park staff or <u>Mass.Parks@mass.gov</u>
- Filling out the Volunteer Interest Form on the DCR website
- Working with a friends group or other affiliated group



Importance of the Program

- The volunteer program builds stewards with companies and individuals. They often return to volunteer again and gain a sense of appreciation for the land, the staff, and the agency's mission.
- Helps staff with simple tasks like trash pickup, planting, etc.



Difficulties of the Program

- Staff capacity
- Funding
- Consistency of Volunteers
- Knowledge of the Program by staff and volunteers



Addressing the Need: Staff Feedback

- Conducted a survey of park staff that works with volunteers.
- 26 responses
- 4 parks that responded do not offer volunteer activities and told why.
- 20 parks gave feedback on difficulties they face and changes they would make.

Takeaways

- Volunteering happens yearround
- Staff want ways to thank and recognize volunteers
- Need a better way to show opportunities to individuals
- Outreach to local groups is needed

Opportunities for the Program

Training for Volunteers and Staff

- Turnover has caused a lack of knowledge of the program amongst staff
- Training would help volunteers be better prepared to work

Volunteer Software

- Utilizing a volunteer management software (VMS) will allow the agency to post opportunities and track volunteer hours.
- Most organizations with similar missions to DCR use this.

Planned Opportunities

- Working with staff to identify volunteer opportunities in the winter
- Gives potential volunteers ready made events they can plan for.
- Takes pressure off of staff to have quick turnaround to volunteer requests.



DCR Employee Innovation Awards

- Opportunity for DCR staff to apply for funds for projects.
- Applied to purchase supplies, a VMS program, and to plan a volunteer recognition event.
- Received the award and began planning.



Changes to Program

- Worked with six parks to plan events from May to October.
- Updated the website with information about the events and other ways to volunteer
