**Holden:** Prescription meds and sharps at Holden Public Safety, 1370 Main Street any time in police department lobby kiosks.

**Paxton:** Prescription meds at Public Safety Complex, 576 Pleasant Street.

**Princeton:** Prescription meds and sharps at Princeton Police Dept., 8 Town Hall Drive.

**West Boylston:** Prescription meds at Police Department lobby, 39 Worcester Street. For needle collection, Residents may call Republic Services 855-737-7871 to arrange free collection.

**Rutland:** Prescription meds and sharps at Rutland Police Dept., 225 Main St.

**Sterling:** Prescription meds & sharps kiosk at Sterling Police Dept, 135 Leominster Rd.

## ACCEPTED FOR A FEE

- \$3 Computer monitor
- \$12 TV
- \$1 Any electronics (not TV's & monitors)
- \$15 Full sized refrigerator or freezer
- \$10 Air conditioner, dehumidifier, dorm fridge
- \$5 Furniture and appliances. Examples: washer, stove, snowblower, mower, hot water tank, toilet, tub, sink, exercise equipment, chair, bureau, entertainment center, mattress, box spring, rug
- \$10 Couch or recliner
- \$15 Sleeper couch
- \$2 Small furniture and appliances. Examples: mower, microwave, plastic chair, large plastic toys, gas grills, wooden chairs, end table
- \$35/ cu. yd. Home project debris, concrete, bricks, wood, roofing shingles, wall board, doors, windows (no creosoted wood or yard waste)
- \$3 Propane tank 20 lb., (\$1 small tank, \$20 larger than standard 20 lb tank)
- \$2 Tire for auto up to 19" with or without rim
- \$10 Truck tires
- \$40 Large equipment tires
- \$8 Fire extinguisher

## NOT ACCEPTED

Smoke detectors: place in trash

BROKEN fluorescent: place in trash

Plastic bags for recycling: return to stores

Sheet plastic: place in trash

## IMPORTANT

PLEASE...

- No early arrivals or waiting at gate or on road
- All cars keep right at entrance to check-in booth
- Remain in car during check-in

## ACCEPTED WITH NO FEE FOR RECYCLING

### MUST BE CLEAN

#### Comingle

- plastics #1 – #7
- #6 styrofoam clean
- glass containers
- metal containers

#### Separated

- paper
- flattened cardboard
- computer parts
- cell phones and other electronics
- scrap metal: aluminum, brass, copper, lead, stainless steel, iron
- all batteries including lead-acid, rechargeable, ni-cad, alkaline, button, nickel-metal hydride, lithium
- mercury switches and thermometers
- **NO BROKEN** fluorescent tubes, CFL bulbs

## HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS PRODUCTS

For a fee of \$4 per gallon or pound

### FOUR SATURDAY COLLECTIONS YEARLY

8 a.m. to noon

April 16, June 18, September 17 and, November 19

(TWO Extra Collections for 2016 – Chemical & Paint **ONLY** collection Saturday, May 7 & October 1)

Materials accepted: chemicals, paints, thinners, solvents, pesticides, herbicides, gasoline, motor oil, pool chemicals, cleaners

Not accepted: explosives, medical

## TAKE OR LEAVE AT THE RECYCLE CENTER

If your household item is in good condition for reuse, please inform the volunteer at check-in. For large furniture and appliances the regular fee will be charged to cover potential disposal cost.

- craft and holiday
- art and school supplies
- fabric arts, yarn
- toys, puzzles, games
- usable household items including linens, dishes, appliances, art, vases, utensils
- containers with lids. Examples: jelly jars, baby food jars, yogurt, coffee cans
- books
- packing peanuts in bags
- sporting goods, sport shoes
- accessories: hats, scarves, gloves, mittens, purses, backpacks
- furniture
- entertainment: records, cassettes, cds, dvds
- office supplies
- working small electronics
- cards and gift wrap
- home medical equipment
- tools and hardware
