Subject:	Public Charge Rule Information Changes
Purpose:	To notify MassHire Workforce Boards, MassHire Career Center Operators and other workforce development partners of information about the <u>Public Charge</u> <u>Rule</u> and its potential impact on individuals applying for a green card or entry into the US.
Background:	Following a Supreme Court decision on January 27, 2020, the federal government will be changing how applications for a green card or entry into the United States may cause an individual to become a public charge. The federal government will begin applying the rule on February 24, 2020. The public charge rules are complicated and may impact immigration status. Applying for benefits – even if denied – could also impact immigration status, so it is recommended

that individuals direct questions to an immigration expert.

The recent changes allow more types of Federally funded public benefits to be considered when making public charge determinations. Benefits considered will now include:

- Certain MassHealth benefits;
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP); and
- Rental assistance under Section 8 housing vouchers & Federal public housing.
