Background: Massachusetts applied for and received National Dislocated Workers Grant

(NDWG) funding in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The funding pays for Disaster Relief Employment – temporary employment for eligible individuals in

the following categories:

Clean up and recovery efforts

 Employment related to the delivery of appropriate humanitarian assistance in the immediate aftermath of the disaster or emergency To date the MA COVID-19 NDWG has identified two project models for these funds:

- Humanitarian Food Service Relief
- Security Detail at MassHire Career Centers

The Humanitarian Food Service Relief Project is intended to temporarily expand the capacity to serve dislocated food service workers and meet the increased demand for temporary workers needed for front line and emergency food distribution agencies as a result of COVID-19.

The project will consist of the MassHire career centers assisting with the recruitment of laid off food service workers to provide temporary employment through SnapChef for deployment at worksites across the Commonwealth.
