The UI requirement regarding referrals to additional services, follow up on those services and the UI feedback loop for those who fail to participate/attend

individual needs. The RESEA program ensures that RESEA customers	are in full
compliance with their UI eligibility requirements.	

The U.S. Department of Labor requires all RESEA customers to be assessed for UI eligibility at each RESEA meeting (Initial RESEA and RESEA Review). The purpose of the UI eligibility assessment is to identify any unemployment insurance eligibility issues, or potential issues, and refer those identified to the Department of Unemployment Assistance for review and/or adjudication.
