In October 2018, there were over 630,000 military spouses in the US and over 30% are employed in fields that require an occupational license. Military spouses are 10 times more likely to move due to military relocation which can result in unemployment and underemployment. Military spouses can benefit from the services of AJCs - learn how to promote services, establish partnerships, and equip staff members to support military spouses in licensed occupations.
