Purpose: To notify MassHire Workforce Boards, MassHire Career Center Operators and other local workforce partners that the MassHire Department of Career Services is seeking a "Call for Ideas" regarding the National Health Emergency (NHE) Dislocated Worker Demonstration Grants to Address the Opioid Crisis funding opportunity as described in the Department of Labor (DOL) Employment and Training Administration (ETA) Training and Employment Guidance Letter (TEGL) <u>TEGL-4-18</u> National Health Emergency Phase Two: Disaster Recovery National Dislocated Worker Grants to Address the Opioid Crisis.

**Background:** DOL/ETA is launching a two-phase, multi-year approach, utilizing grant funds to combat the economic and workforce impacts associated with the opioid health crisis, as well as encourage more individuals to enter professions that could address the crisis. The first phase has proven successful. DOL plans to conduct a second phase in Program Years 2023 and 2024, pending availability of funds.

NHE grants will be awarded to eligible applicants that propose innovative approaches for addressing the economic and workforce-related impacts on communities affected by the opioid epidemic. Partnerships between the workforce system and other agencies will be central to these projects. **The goals of these grants are to:** 

- Test innovative approaches to address the economic and workforcerelated impacts of the opioid epidemic,
- Provide training and support activities to dislocated workers (including displaced homemakers), new entrants in the workforce, and incumbent workers, including individuals in these populations who are or have been impacted by the opioid crisis,
- To provide training that builds the skilled workforce in professions that could impact the causes and treatment of the opioid crisis, including addiction and substance-abuse treatment, mental health, and pain management.
