SBA Loan Fund

The Baker-Polito Administration announced on March 18, 2020, that the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) approved the Commonwealth's disaster declaration and will offer low-interest federal disaster loans for working capital to Massachusetts small businesses suffering substantial economic injury as a result of the Coronavirus (COVID-19).

Administrative Tax Relief

- On Wednesday, March 18, the Baker-Polito Administration announced administrative tax relief measures for small local positive ses that have been impacted by the ongoing COVID-19 outbreak, especially in the restaurant and hospitality sectors.
- His tax relief includes postponing the collection of regular sales tax, meals tax, and room occupancy tax, tibat would be due in March, April and May so that they will instead be due on the 20.
- Additionally, all penalties and otherwise apply will be waived.
- Businesses that paid less than \$2,0,000 in regular sales plus meals taxes in the year ending February 29, 2020 will be eligible for relief for sales and meals taxes, and be ness that paid less than \$150,000 in room occupancy taxes in the year ending February 29, 2020 will be eligible for relief with respect to room occupancy taxes.
